

Day 1: Fly from Australia to Cairo

Wed 17 May 2023

Day 2: Arrive Cairo

Thu 18 May 2023

Welcome to Egypt, a country known for its historical sites and world wonders. Egypt's history spans more than 5,000 years and encompasses the origin of civilisation, the rise of the Greeks and Romans, the establishment of the Jewish, Christian and Islamic religions, the colonial era when first France and then the English ruled the country and finally, a return to independence. We begin in Cairo, the sprawling capital of Egypt and the largest city in Africa.

This evening we'll meet our fellow travellers at a group welcome dinner.

Overnight: The St Regis (or similar)

Meals: Dinner

Day 3: Cairo - Giza - Cairo

Fri 19 May 2023

Our touring in Egypt begins at the oldest structures in existence and one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World, the amazing Great Pyramids of Giza. We'll visit the nearby Great Sphinx, with the body of a lion and the head of a king, often referred to as the national symbol of Egypt. Next, lunch will be served at '9 Pyramids lounge', a spectacular and unique venue which serves traditional cuisine whilst overlooking the pyramids themselves. Finally, we visit the Grand Egyptian Museum, also known as the Giza Museum, the largest archaeological museum complex in the world. The museum hosts more than 100,000 artifacts and the largest collection of Tutankhamun relics ever displayed.

Day 4: Cairo – Abu Simbel – Aswan

Sat 20 May 2023

An early start this morning as we transfer to the airport for our flight to Abu Simbel. Here, we visit the incredible UNESCO listed twin temples of Abu Simbel. The temples were originally carved out of the mountainside during the reign of Pharaoh Ramses II in the 13th century BC, as a monument to himself and his queen, Nefertari. We will spend a few hours exploring the temples before returning to the airport to fly to Aswan.

Upon arrival in Aswan, we check into our hotel, the Old Cataract where we will spend the next two nights. Located in the Nubian Desert on the banks of the Nile, opposite Elephantine Island, the majestic hotel sits on a pink granite cliff overlooking the world's longest river. This grand hotel opened its doors in 1900 and has since hosted numerous celebrities and luminaries, such as Winston Churchill, Princess Diana and Margaret Thatcher. Here we'll enjoy high tea on the terrace, an elegant experience which involves delectable sandwiches and cakes, served on a 3-tiered stand.

Day 5: Aswan

Sun 21 May 2023

Today will be spent exploring the incredible sights of Aswan. On a half day tour, our first stop is the picturesque Philae Temple on Agilkia Island. Philae is dedicated to Isis, the goddess of magic. It was originally located on a smaller nearby island but when the original Aswan Dam was built it was subject to flooding. During the 1960's in a massive international effort led by UNESCO Philae Temple (all 47,000 stones) was moved to its current location about 500m from its original site. We then visit the High Dam, a huge rockfill dam which captures the world's longest river, the Nile River, in the world's third-largest reservoir, Lake Nasser. The dam was completed in 1970 after ten years of work. We'll also see the majestic Unfinished Obelisk, the largest known ancient obelisk, even though it was never completed.

Our day finishes with a felucca ride at sunset before a sumptuous special dinner in the opulent 1902 Restaurant at the Old Cataract Hotel.

Please note: the dress code within the 1902 Restaurant is semi-formal. Men are required to wear a jacket (tie not necessary) and only dark jeans are acceptable for ladies.

Day 6: Aswan – Nile Cruise

Mon 22 May 2023

After a morning at leisure, we'll embark our luxury Le Fayan Nile River cruise ship where we will spend three nights on board. The modern cruise ship has a sun deck, pool, spacious lounges, bar, gym, spa, outside dining and fine dining restaurant. The boat provides an attentive hospitality experience while exploring Egypt's most renowned temples and historic sites.

Lunch is served on board and the rest of the afternoon is free to enjoy at your own pace. Relax by the water or take a dip in the pool on the warm and breezy roof deck or enjoy a drink by the bar or terrace.

Day 7: Nile Cruise

Tue 23 May 2023

This morning we'll set sail from Aswan to Kom Ombo. We will visit the riverside Temple of Kom Ombo, dedicated to the gods Sobek and Haroeris. We'll then cruise to Edfu. The Egyptian city has a population of approximately sixty thousand people. It is famous for the Temple of Edfu, dedicated to the Falcon God Horus, the main attraction which we'll visit today. This beautiful ancient temple is one of the best-preserved in Egypt and the second largest after Karnak Temple. We continue cruising along the Nile as we set sail for Luxor via Esna Lock.

Day 8: Nile Cruise

Wed 24 May 2023

Our sightseeing begins at the fascinating Karnak Temple, dedicated to the Pharaoh Amun. Approximately 30 pharaohs contributed to the temple's structure over time, which explains its monumental size!

This evening we enjoy an exclusive private visit to Luxor Temple. Connected to Karnak Temple by a 3-kilometre-long Avenue of Sphinxes, Luxor Temple is home to a 25-metre-tall pink granite obelisk, which was part of a matching pair until the 1830s when one was given to France. It now stands in the centre of the Place de la Concorde in Paris.

Day 9: Nile Cruise - Luxor

Thu 25 May 2023

This morning we disembark the Nile cruise ship and bid farewell to the crew.

Today we discover the sights of Luxor on a half day tour. Our first stop for the day is the Valley of the Kings, where we have entry to visit Tutankhamun and Seti I's Tomb. Carved deep into the limestone rock, each tomb has a similar pattern of three corridors, an antechamber and a sarcophagus chamber. We'll be able to descend into the tomb to see examples of the elaborate and incredibly well-preserved hieroglyphic paintings.

We'll then visit the Valley of the Queens including the tomb of Nefertari, the Great Wife of Pharaoh Rameses II. Next, we visit the Colossi of Memnon, a historic landmark consisting of two massive statues of the Pharaoh Amenhotep III.

Day 10: Luxor - Cairo

Fri 26 May 2023

This morning we'll transfer to Luxor airport for our flight back to Cairo.

We will visit El Moez street and the 14th century Khan el-Khalili Bazaar, a major souk in Cairo's Islamic District. Famous for its handmade crafts, it's also the perfect place to enjoy a traditional Arabic coffee. There are no fixed prices here, so make sure you practice your haggling skills!

Tonight, we'll enjoy a group farewell dinner.

Day 11: Cairo – Istanbul

Sat 27 May 2023

Today marks the completion of our incredible adventure across Egypt as we fly to Istanbul where we will be transferred to our hotel near the famous Blue Mosque for our overnight stay.

Day 12: Depart Istanbul, Turkey

Sun 28 May 2023 | Depart 5:00pm

You will be transferred to the port to board your cruise on Seabourn Encore.

Spanning Europe & Asia, exotic Istanbul is one of the world's most fascinating cities. Domes and minarets enhance the skyline. In the old Stamboul area, traces remain of every city built since the community was established over 600 years before Christ. Once Rome's eastern capital, Istanbul was also the centre of the huge Ottoman Empire. Landmarks



include Hagia Sophia, once Christendom's greatest church; the Blue Mosque with its striking Iznik tiles; Topkapi Palace, containing a sultan's ransom in treasures; Chora Church with its Byzantine mosaics; and the Grand Bazaar, the ultimate shopping experience.

Day 13: Myrina, Nisos Limnos, Greece

Mon 29 May 2023 | Arrive 9:00am - Depart 5:00pm

Limnos is an arid, volcanic island located near the mouth of the Dardenelles. The volcano and sulphurous springs on the island inspired many legends in ancient times. Limnos was the mythological home of Hephaistos (Vulcan), who was cast from Mount Olympus by his father Zeus and landed on Limnos, breaking his leg in the process. Lame ever since, the God of Fire lived on the island and toiled at his forges, the volcanoes of the island, teaching the people of the island the art of metalworking. Jason and the Argonauts stopped here during their quest for the Golden Fleece and, during the Trojan War, Hercules' companion, Philoctetes, was cured of a gangrenous wound by the magical earth of the island.

Day 14: Cesme, Turkey

Tue 30 May 2023 | Arrive 8:00am – Depart 6:00pm

A popular holiday and resort destination, Cesme is located on a promontory on the top of the peninsula that carries the same name. The town itself is dominated by the medieval Cesme Castle, while the back streets invite a casual stroll with their old Ottoman and Greek houses that charm passers-by. South of the castle there is an Ottoman caravansari built in 1528 that has since been transformed into a lovely boutique hotel and check the Greek Orthodox church of Ayios Haralambos to see the current art exhibition. Along with the historical attractions, visitors will enjoy local pleasures, such as a dip in the thermal baths followed by the culinary delights of native fruits, artisan cheeses and local wines.



Day 15: Bodrum, Turkey

Wed 31 May 2023 | Arrive 8:00am – Depart 11:00pm

Today Bodrum is a picturesque yacht harbour filled with traditional woodvarnished sailboats, charming outdoor cafes and streets bursting with small shops selling carpets, leatherwear, jewellery and local artwork. In antiquity, it was the site of ancient Halicarnassus. Under King Mausolus, the city prospered, and in death, the king left the city its most enduring legacy, his majestic tomb, from which we derive the term "mausoleum." Only its massive foundations remain today but it was the largest tomb ever built by the Greeks and one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World. Models on the site recreate its form for visitors. Alexander the Great attacked the city in 334 BC, levelling all but the Mausoleum, which was later destroyed by an earthquake.

When the Knights of St. John lost their castle in Smyrna in 1402, they came here. Finding the mausoleum in ruins, they used the stone to construct the Castle of St. Peter, which proudly stood sentinel to the city. Together with their fortifications on Kos and Rhodes, the Knights dominated the south-eastern Aegean, running a hospital for passing pilgrims and ruling the seas as privateers in swift vessels. They remained until 1523, when Ottoman ruler, Suleyman the Magnificent, conquered Rhodes and the Knights' position became untenable. The castle still dominates the harbour and houses an archeological museum.

Day 16: Symi, Greece

Thu 1 Jun 2023 | Arrive 8:00am - Depart 5:00pm

Symi town harbour is tucked into one of the island's many corrugated coves, many of which enfold sand beaches. The island is located just offshore of the Turkish coast in the Dodecanese chain near Rhodes. The harbour is fronted by ranks of unusually colourful neoclassical houses, and steps lead to the upper town of Ano Symi and the requisite Kastro. The Monastery of Archangel Michael Panormitis is an important pilgrimage site for Greek Orthodox adherents and boasts a likewise unusually colourful and elaborate bell tower. The town has thirteen major churches and dozens of chapels, many dating to the Byzantine era of its multifaceted history. Also in the harbour is a War Memorial with a bas relief of an ancient trireme fronted by a Dove of Peace.

Day 17: Thira (Santorini), Greece

Fri 2 Jun 2023 | Arrive 8:00am - Depart 11:00pm

"Thira, the Wild Island" and "Kalliste, the Fairest One" - all terms of endearment for this seductive, volcanic Greek island in the Sea of Crete. Extraordinary for its black sand beaches and sheer limestone

cliffs, Santorini also showcases remnants of the Phoenician, Spartan and Minoan cultures, which fell under the island's spell - an unvarying, irresistible lure that continues to this day. Fira, the picturesque, pedestrian-only capital, is reached from the seaport via a short cable car ride that offers thrilling views as you ascend.

Day 18: Ermoupolis, Nisos Syros, Greece

Sat 3 Jun 2023 | Arrive 8:00am – Depart 6:00pm

Syros is an important island in the Cyclades, but rather off the tourist map. Just the sort of place we like. The town (named for Hermes) is the capital of the island group, and its airy Miaouli Plaza is a wonderful, palmlined place to sit in a cafe and have a drink. The medieval Venetian village of Ano Syros crowns a hilltop nearby. Wander the narrow, cobblestone streets to the impressive 13th-century Agios Georgios church. Back in town, the Eastern Orthodox Church of the Assumption holds an icon by the Greek painter known as El Greco. A small archeological museum has some very fine Cycladic figures, and the Ermoupolis Industrial Museum recounts the island legacy of shipbuilding and other occupations.

Day 19: Piraeus (Athens), Greece

Sun 4 Jun 2023 | Arrive 7:00am – Depart 9:00pm

Piraeus has been the port for Athens since 482 BC. The busy harbour is filled with ferries and cruise ships making their way to the Greek Islands and other Mediterranean cities. The busy metropolis of Athens and its treasure trove of antiquities lie just a few miles from the port. Even as the reality of the modern city took hold, with its high-rise apartments, crowded sidewalks and bustling traffic, the beauty of the Acropolis, the outstanding museums, charming cafés, sidewalk markets and startling views come together in a cultural mosaic for all to enjoy.

Day 20: Skiathos, Greece

Mon 5 Jun 2023 | Arrive 10:00am – Depart 8:00pm

This small island is the westernmost of the Northern Sporades group in the Aegean Sea. It is best known for its beaches, of which the island boasts 60 beaches along its 44 km coastline. These include the nearly legendary Kokounaries beach, Banana beach and Lalaria beach with its picturesque rock arch, which is accessible only by small boats. Skiathos town curves around a pretty harbour and has a lively nightlife during the tourist season. The campanile of the Panaghia Limnia church, built in 1837, rises above pine trees on a hill atop the town. A few miles away through the island's handsome pine forests is the Evangelistria Monastery, only entered through an imposing stone gateway.



Day 21: Kavala (Neapolis), Greece

Tue 6 Jun 2023 | Arrive 8:00am - Depart 5:00pm

A major seaport for the Macedonia region of northern Greece, Kavala captivates visitors with more than 2,500 years of history. Known as Neapolis during antiquity, the port's enviable position along the Via Egnatia — an ancient trade route that linked Europe and Asia — made it a cultural crossroads for East and West. Byzantine and Ottoman influences abound, from Kavala's medieval fortress and Halil Bey Mosque to its dramatic, 16th-century aqueduct that divides the old town from the larger city. The Imaret, constructed in 1817, served as an Islamic seminary for more than 100 years; the exquisite complex is now a luxury hotel. Kavala was a hub for the tobacco industry during the mid-1800s; the interactive Tobacco Museum offers excellent insight into this "Mecca of Tobacco," while Kapnergatis Square and Kyprou Street are lined with grand neoclassical buildings and mansions of former tobacco merchants. Just to the north lies the UNESCO World Heritage site of Philippi, one of the world's most important Greco-Roman cities and a centre of Christianity after Apostle Paul visited in 49 AD.

Days 22-23: Istanbul, Turkey

Wed 7 Jun – Thu 8 Jun 2023 | Arrive 12:00pm on Day 22 – Depart 11:00pm on Day 23

Day 25: Izmir, Turkey

Sat 10 Jun 2023 | Arrive 8:00am - Depart 6:00pm

The magnificent Aegean coast features no shortage of appealing ports of call, and Izmir is a fine example thereof. The birthplace of Homer has grown into a thriving metropolis, filled with fine hotels along its sweeping bay. A fine Archaeology Museum and Ethnography Museum house a multitude of treasures and exhibits, while nearby resorts provide distractions of another sort. Earthquakes and fires over the centuries have obliterated most of ancient Smyrna, as it was once known, but remnants of the 4th-century fort atop Mt. Pagos still provide excellent views of the city and Gulf of Izmir.

Day 26: Kusadasi (Ephesus), Turkey

Sun 11 Jun 2023 | Arrive 7:00am - Depart 11:00pm

Kusadasi, which means "bird island", is set in a superb gulf known for its sparkling water, broad sandy beaches and large marina. The city has managed to retain a certain earthiness while doing a brisk trade in Turkish carpets and leather goods to visitors. The town's old quarter is a picturesque maze of winding streets and houses adorned with flowers and birdcages. In the centre stands a 17th-century caravanserai, now converted into a hotel. The resort is also gateway to important sites of archaeological and religious interest.

Day 27: Mykonos, Greece

Mon 12 Jun 2023 | Arrive 8:00am - Depart 11:00pm

The quintessential Greek island of Mykonos is marked by whitewashed houses, domed churches, imposing windmills, and a labyrinth of winding streets designed to disorient pirates. Everywhere there is a dash of bright, bold blue - doors, shutters and window frames, sea and sky. The harbour bustles with colourful fishing boats, vendors selling fish and locals gathered with visitors in the casual seaside cafes. The port even comes with two beloved mascots, the pelicans Petros and Irini.

Day 28: Milos, Nisos Melos, Greece

Tue 13 Jun 2023 | Arrive 8:00am - Depart 5:00pm

In prehistory, Milos was a source for precious obsidian, the volcanic glass that yielded razor-sharp blades in the Neolithic age. Its volcanic origins still produce minerals which comprise a substantial portion of its revenues. Although less well-known by travellers, it shares the signature attractions of its Cycladic neighbours Santorini and Mykonos. If they do know anything about Milos, it's that the famous marble statue of Aphrodite known as the Venus de Milo was discovered here. Beaches and white-washed villages, combined with a dramatically carved coastline, make Milos a good choice. Plaka, the de facto capital, is on a hilltop some distance from the port of Adamas. Its Archaeological Museum has artifacts from the Neolithic to the Byzantine periods. There are mineral springs on the island which have been recommended by physicians since the time of Herodotus.

Day 29: Piraeus (Athens), Greece

Wed 14 Jun 2023 | Arrive 7:00am

After disembarking the ship, you will be transferred to the airport for your flight back to Australia.



Reservations and payments
